Charter of the Whidbey Swordplay Association

Article I: Name

The name of this organization shall be the Whidbey Swordplay Association (WSA).

Article II: Mission Statement

The Whidbey Swordplay Association is dedicated to the study, practice, and promotion of historical and modern European martial arts. Our mission is to foster a community of enthusiasts who appreciate the art, history, and discipline of swordsmanship, polearms, and other martial weapons, while ensuring a safe and respectful environment for all participants.

Article III: Objectives

- 1. **Education:** To provide structured training sessions and workshops in various forms of swordplay, including but not limited to historical European martial arts (HEMA) and modern fencing techniques.
- 2. **Community Engagement:** To build a supportive community through events, competitions, and social gatherings that promote camaraderie and mutual respect.
- 3. **Safety and Respect**: To uphold high standards of safety and sportsmanship in all practices and events, ensuring a welcoming atmosphere for all members.
- 4. **Historical Appreciation**: To study and celebrate the rich history of swordsmanship and its cultural significance.
- 5. **Skill Development**: To help members improve their skills, knowledge, and confidence in martial weapons and combat through regular practice and mentorship.

Article IV: Membership

- 1. **Eligibility**: Membership is open to individuals of all skill levels, ages, and backgrounds who have an interest in swordplay and martial combat.
- 2. **Dues:** Members shall pay annual dues, the amount of which shall be determined by the Executive Committee and reviewed annually.
- 3. **Rights and Responsibilities:** Members are expected to adhere to the principles of safety, respect, and good sportsmanship. They have the right to participate in all association activities and to request a vote on association matters.

Article V: Governance

- 1. **Executive Committee**: The association shall be governed by an Executive Committee consisting of:
 - Head Instructor
 - First Instructor
 - Second Instructor
 - Third Instructor
- 2. **Meetings:** The Executive Committee shall meet monthly to discuss association matters, and a general membership meeting will be held quarterly to provide updates and gather input from members.

Article VI: Activities

- 1. Training Sessions: Regular training sessions shall be held to develop skills in swordplay.
- 2. **Workshops and Seminars:** Special events featuring guest instructors and experts in swordsmanship and other martial weapons shall be organized periodically.

- 3. **Competitions**: The association may host friendly competitions to promote skill development and camaraderie among members.
- 4. **Social Cherits:** Social gatherings shall be organized to strengthen community bonds and celebrate achievements.

Article VII: Amendments

This charter may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present at a general membership meeting. Proposed amendments must be submitted in writing to the Executive Committee at least two weeks prior to the meeting.

Article VIII: Dissolution

In the event that the Whidbey Swordplay Association must be dissolved, any remaining assets after settling debts shall be donated to a local charity or organization that aligns with the mission and values of the association.
